

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

Faith is our personal response to a God who continues to reveal himself to us and invites us to recognise his holiness and beauty. Bible shows us the ways in which God reveals himself to human persons and invites him to respond in faith. Every situation in the world presents a very great contrast between human powerlessness in the face of sickness and death on the one hand, and the striking force of faith on the other.

We are in a constant relationship with God who transforms us, heals us and removes our pains and transforms them into joy. Faith works miracles and there are the thousands of small miracles that no-one notices them except those concerned. Certainly, people are aware of the work of the power of God in human situation. In this rational world we need the spiritual insight to recognise the working of these miracles. But faith is there like a small seed which when planted in the human heart grows slowly to yield fruit.

Today's readings invite us to reflect on how profoundly faith influences our view of the world and our actions. In the Gospel, faith brings new life to the Synagogue Official's daughter and to a woman who was suffering for twelve years. She only touched the garments of Jesus, and she was healed.
