

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

Last week we heard in the Gospel of Jesus feeding the multitude of people with the multiplication of loaves and fish. We heard the verbs, <u>took</u> bread, <u>gave thanks</u>, and <u>distributed</u>. Clear links can be made to the Eucharist and this miracle, and also, we see early signs of what will become later as the structure of the Eucharistic celebration.

This week begins the 'Bread of Life Discourse'.

Jesus may come across as being a little blunt with the disciples. He calls them out and questions their motive. What is the real reason why they follow, what is the real reason that they are drawn? Are they drawn because he has worked healing miracles? Are they looking for him because they need more food? Although they witnessed the healings and ate their fill, they did not recognise these miracles as signs. They do not see spiritually what the feeding miracle revealed about Jesus and his work. Hence Jesus withdrew to the mountain to evade their attempt to make him king.

Jesus challenges the disciples to look beyond what they see and what they receive. He challenges them to think about food that perishes to food that endures for eternal life. He establishes the basic principle for the discourse: people should work to obtain the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give.

In answer to the crowd's challenge to the question about bread and what work will be done for them, Jesus reminds them that it was not Moses who gave them bread from heaven but rather it was God the Father who gives them true bread from Heaven. Moses was not the source of the manna: it was the Lord. The Lord provided Israel with manna, and he continues his providential care by providing true bread from Heaven.

The description that this bread comes down from heaven connects this bread with Jesus, who, as the Son of Man, came down from Heaven. This heavenly bread gives abundant life to a world in great need of it, both in the time of Jesus and in our world today. Jesus identifies himself as the true life giving bread from the Father; "I am the Bread of Life" says Jesus and in doing so reveals himself and his saving work as the bread of life. Jesus reminds God's chosen people that He is the Father's gift who will grant eternal life to those who believe in him.
