Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

11th August 2024

Sunday reflection on the Gospel according to John 6:41-51

After Jesus had fed the 5000 with five barley loaves and two fish, they wanted to make him king. They acknowledged Him as the "prophet who is to come into the world." In His discourse with the Jews, He said that He came down from heaven to give life to the world and that He is the true bread that endures into eternity. But the Jews knew Him as the son of Joseph and Mary. They lacked faith in Jesus, which is a gift from God. Those who have that gift will come to Him and believe in Him.

Jesus is the bread of everlasting life, unlike manna. Jesus' very body would be turned into the bread which would sustain those who believe in Him. He was directly foretelling of the Eucharist. Those who accept God's gift of faith in Jesus will receive further revelation from God. It is only through the Son made man, that human beings can see the Father through the eyes of faith.

Manna gave the Jews physical life only while the true bread which is Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist will give eternal life. John is clearly connecting the bread of life with the redemptive death of Christ.

Before we accept the teaching on the Eucharist, we first accept Him as Divine, as the Son of God. The Jews had strict monotheism as their God was only one. Therefore, they could not accept the divinity of Jesus. The Galileans who denied Jesus begun a long line of unbelievers who had stretched down through the centuries to our own day.

We believe in a loving God and in His divine Son, Jesus Christ, who came on earth to bring us to heaven, and in the Holy Spirit who completes the work of sanctification in us. The Eucharist is our food for the journey. When Jesus said, "the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh", He hit the climax toward which the discourse with the Jews was leading.

As Elijah was strengthened by miraculous food and drink in the wilderness to reach the mountain of God, so also the Christians who have the gift of faith are strengthened by the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist on their journey to heaven, to beatific vision.

Elijah was seeking strength and renewal from the mountain of God and only God could offer this. So also, Christians in faith seek renewal and strength from the altar where they receive the Eucharist, a great gift from God.

When we receive the Eucharist, we become Christ-like. St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians is exhorting us that to be Christ-like is to be always forgiving, always kind, always tender-hearted, and not grieve the Holy Spirit of God. This means that we put away all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with malice.

Therefore, spend your whole life coming to Jesus, feed on His word and the Eucharist to be strengthened and empowered to be virtuous while avoiding vices. Be imitators of God as beloved children and live in love as Christ loved us and gave Himself for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

Cathedral Car Park and Staircase Driveway on the Cathedral lawns and Driveway in the Underground Car park
