Sunday Reflection

Divorce is an issue that's naturally one of great sensitivity. Many families are intimately affected by it, either directly through the pain of separation, family dislocation, and the subsequent care of children, or indirectly as children lose regular contact with members of their extended family. The fallout from divorce is often particularly felt by grandparents. Some lose regular contact with their beloved grandchildren, while others effectively become their day-to-day carers

Our so-called no-fault divorce laws were formulated to remove the conflict that used to exist in this process. But many who have been through the family law court system might sometimes wonder how successful this approach has been.

We should not use this gospel passage to become too moralistic and judgemental. While we should certainly celebrate the ideal espoused by Jesus, we must also be aware that that ideal might not be attainable for some. If we look at the larger picture given to us by all the Gospels, we see Jesus' mercy and forgiveness constantly on display in human relationships. Recall the tender story of forgiveness, reconciliation, and evangelisation in the beautiful multi-layered story of Jesus' meeting with the Samaritan woman at the well in John's Gospel (Jn 4:1-42).

There's no doubt that Jesus recognised the reality of divorce in his society. But that didn't stop him from espousing his Heavenly Father's intention for the relationship between man and woman, as we hear in the second creation story in Genesis (Gen 2:4-25). He did this because he recognised that males and females were always meant to complement each other.

He knew something that we all still recognise. This being the traditional family is remarkable in what it brings together: physical desire, friendship, companionship, emotional kinship and love, the begetting of children and their protection and care, their early education and induction into an identity and a history. Seldom has any institution woven together so many different drives and desires, roles and responsibilities. It made sense of the world and gave it a human face, the face of love.

The traditional family is not one lifestyle choice among many. It is the best means we have yet discovered for nurturing future generations and enabling children to grow in a matrix of stability and love. It's where we first take the risk of giving and receiving love. It's where one generation passes on its values to the next, ensuring the continuity of civilisation.

In divorce, these wonderful attributes are diminished or lost. In the midst of this moral teaching, it's easy to miss something theologically profound. Three Sundays ago, we heard Peter's proclamation, "You are the Christ". But Jesus' teaching today demonstrates that his identity is even more remarkable. The Pharisees, in their attempt to trick Jesus, quote Moses, the putative author of Deuteronomy 24:1, saying: Moses allowed us...to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.

The fact that Jesus felt it possible to contradict Moses demonstrates his divinity, his equality with the original divine law-maker. For the Jews, only God could alter the divinely inspired stipulation of the law. So, we find Jesus referring to God's original intention for the relationship between man and woman, as seen in our first reading. By implication, Jesus, as the Word of God, was present at the time when God made this stipulation. Therefore, Jesus' doubling down on God's original intention is consistent with his divine nature.

Therefore, as a Church, we should be a witness to God's intention for us as human beings and celebrate the beauty of a life lived in selfless love of another in a lifelong marriage relationship. At the same time, we need to be pastorally sensitive to those who struggle with that commitment, especially those escaping abusive relationships.

It's a teaching that consistently presents many challenges but remains as valid today as ever.

2024 Catholic Mission Appeal



Catholic Mission is the Pope's international Mission agency in Australia. An international organisation that partners with communities, helping them to flourish by supporting grassroots projects, including healthcare, education, and spiritual care. The focus project this year is Mongolia, House of Mercy, with the Pope opening the centre in 2023. On a quiet night, Chuluunbaatar stands guard at a warehouse. It's early in winter, but the chill at night creeps in gently. The shift was routine until he learned that a car had crashed and fallen into freezing waters. His instinct was to help, but as he went to reach for a towrope, his life changed forever. "I was trying to get the tow rope from the top of a two-storey container. But one of the tow ropes pulled me down, and one of the five teeth of the other towrope fell into my leg."

Chuluunbaatar's right leg was broken, and after the incident, he would face over a year in hospital. The severity of the injury has left him with ongoing pain. Unable to work to support himself Chuluunbaatar's future crumbled. In his time of need, Chuluunbaatar turned to the House of Mercy, located in Mongolia's capital Ulaanbaatar. The House of Mercy provides a sanctuary for people with a variety of needs; people without a place to call home, people fleeing domestic violence, people in need of a warm meal or a bed. Chuluunbaatar is one of the many who rely on the services provided.

Today, the House of Mercy needs material support in order to continue supporting the patrons who use its service. With limited social services available elsewhere, this House provides not just shelter and food, but access to basic medical care, showers and laundry, and counselling.
