Sunday Reflection

Our Gospel this weekend introduces us to the figure of the blind beggar Bartimaeus. Little is known of Bartimaeus other than he was the Son of Timeaus. Perhaps we don't need to know who he was, other than that he was blind. What we do know is that he had a request of Jesus, he had an attitude towards Jesus that was one of reverence and respect. *'Son of David have pity on me'*

This tells us that while Bartimaeus could not physically see, he could hear. He has heard the promises of the Prophets, he has heard the stories of the early journeys of Jesus. While his eyes were physically shut, his heart was spiritually open. When Jesus calls him forward, he shows further signs of reverence and faith in the *'Son of Man'* by throwing off his cloak and racing toward Jesus. Our Lord asks of him *'What do you want me to do for you?'* and in his simplicity and humility Bartimaeus responds, *'Master let me see again'*. This is in great contrast to last weeks' Gospel where the disciples were after glory and status. Bartimaeus seeks no special privileges.

There is more in this encounter than the healing of the blind man Bartimaeus. The Gospel teaches us that Jesus came not to give power and glory but rather to restore humanities fallen nature. To allow people to see the beauty of God in the person of Christ Jesus the Word made Flesh. Last week we had the tragic figures of James and John, they were in fact more blind than what Bartimaeus ever was.

October 2024: Catholic Mission Appeal

Catholic Mission is the Pope's international Mission agency in Australia. An international organisation that partners with communities, helping them to flourish by supporting grassroots projects, including healthcare, education, and spiritual care. Our network of religious and lay missionaries operates in Africa, Asia, Europe, Oceania, the Americas.



The focus project this year is Mongolia, House of Mercy, with the Pope opening the centre in 2023. On a quiet night, Chuluunbaatar stands guard at a warehouse. It's early in winter, but the chill at night creeps in gently. The shift was routine until he learned that a car had crashed and fallen into freezing waters. His instinct was to help, but as he went to reach for a towrope, his life changed forever. *"I was trying to get the tow rope from the top of a two-storey container. But one of the tow ropes pulled me down, and one of the five teeth of the other towrope fell into my leg."*

Chuluunbaatar's right leg was broken, and after the incident, he would face over a year in hospital. The severity of the injury has left him with ongoing pain. Unable to work to support himself Chuluunbaatar's future crumbled. **In his time of need, Chuluunbaatar turned to the House of Mercy, located in Mongolia's capital Ulaanbaatar. The House of Mercy provides a sanctuary for people with a variety of needs; people without a place to call home, people fleeing domestic violence, people in need of a warm meal or a bed. Chuluunbaatar is one of the many who rely on the services provided.**

Today, the House of Mercy needs material support in order to continue supporting the patrons who use its service. With limited social services available elsewhere, this House provides not just shelter and food, but access to basic medical care, showers and laundry, and counselling. Your gift today can help ensure the House of Mercy can provide practical support for people like Chuluunbaatar.
