Third Sunday of Advent - Year C

15th December 2024

Sunday Reflection

John the Baptist is not the Messiah but only the prophet of the Messiah; The forerunner, the preparer. He is the setup act, not the main event; The appetiser, not the meal; the bulldozer that levelled the ground for the road, not the road. He points to Jesus and says, "He must increase I must decrease" and "I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals". Why? Because John baptises only with water, and that water, the water in John's baptism is only a symbol of moral cleaning up, an external expression of the inner repentance that he preaches. But the Messiah, the promised one, Jesus, will baptise also with fire, with the fire of the Holy-Spirit that is God himself. And the water of Jesus' baptism will be more than a symbol: it will actually give us the life of God, the Spirit of God.

If anyone ever asks you what Jesus gave to the world that it didn't have before, don't answer morality, because the world already had that. God already gave the moral law, both through conscience and through the law and the prophets, through Moses and the Ten Commandments and through a long line of prophets, culminating with John the Baptist. So what did Jesus give us that the law and the prophets didn't give us? The answer is very simple he gave us God.

This sense of joy that the gospel invites us this weekend is not a 'feeling good' joy. It's not like a drink that makes us happy. It requires work to learn to detach ourselves from whatever is holding us back from meeting our Lord. Advent is about waiting, sharing, and joy. Let us share what we have as we wait for the one who is coming. While we wait, let us make this time the most joy- filled experience of our faith by detaching ourselves from what holds us back from being fully joyful. The Church invites us to pray and reflect on what gives us joy other than pouring ourselves out for the poor. We may want to pray with the following questions, What is holding me back in this season? How can I happily empty myself to receive the Lord? How would I feel if I found that my reluctance to share what I have would impact the coming of our Christ in the life of someone in need?

May this season of waiting and giving be our greatest joy of emptying ourselves to receive Jesus.
