Sunday Reflection

Pontius Pilate is not the only judge. Many of us are called upon to make judgements about other people. Of course, those connected to the law and its enforcement make judgements about others, but so do teachers, doctors, nurses, midwives and others in the caring professions.

So too do we in our family lives adjudicating between competing claims of our children and their behaviour, and in our general relationships between family and friends. We make judgements too in the marketplace deciding which product we will buy.

Sadly we also make judgements where there is no need, forming opinions about people we see on the basis of some aspect of their appearance or behaviour. In today's gospel Jesus shows us the inadequacy of making judgements purely by externals.

The widow has given very little, a few cents. This appears insignificant compared to the large coins clunking as they are thrown by more affluent donors into the wooden box in which the money was collected. In fact she has given everything whilst those other seemingly more impressive donors gave a calculated, affordable amount.

We need to reflect on our attitudes, to others, and also to our own service to our brothers and sisters.

Are we more impressed by the generous gifts of large amounts, which are, in any event tax deductible than the unceasing hours volunteered by the sacristan, the hours of practice and rehearsal of the musician and the reader, the dedication of the altar server or extraordinary minister, the efforts of the elderly and the young and their carers just to be with us?

Secondly, let us reflect on ourselves. Are we really committed to our brothers and sisters doing our best to enhance their experience in the Church, helping wherever we perceive a need, or are we simply coasting along in the comfort zone we established for ourselves years ago?

In our first two readings we see examples of this selfless giving: the widow who fed Elijah; our Lord the great high priest who gave Himself in sacrifice to open the way to the Father for us.
