Sunday Reflection

Today is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, which marks the 40th day since Christmas. It marks the end of the liturgical season which began with the 1st Sunday of Advent, and brings to a close our focus on the events surrounding the birth of Our Lord.

Today is also the World Day of Consecrated Life, when the Church acknowledges and celebrates the contribution of Consecrated Life to her mission. Throughout the history of the Church, there have been countless Christians who have received the vocation to live the Christian life in a particularly radical and specific way. These women and men have taken on vows of poverty, obedience and celibacy and lived (usually in common) lives with a specific mission, be that contemplative prayer, the monastic life, teaching, care for the poor and vulnerable, preaching, to name but a few.

Our Cathedral Parish has been enriched by the presence and work of a great number of those living the Religious Life over many years, a presence which continues to today. The presence and work of the Sisters of Mercy, the Dominican Sisters, the Christian Brothers, The Adorers of the Blood of Christ, the Passionist Fathers and the Daughters of Charity live on in our parish community. Historically we have benefitted from the work of Missionaries of the Sacred Heart, Society of St. Eugene de Maznod and the Marist Brothers among others. Our present administrator Fr. Lancy is a member of the Congregation of Holy Cross.

Let us then today give thanks to God for the great gift that Consecrated Life has been to the Church. Let us also pray for Religious around the world, that they may continue faithfully to live out their specific charism and that many more will answer the call "duc in altum – put out into the deep."

Jubilee Year 2025: Pilgrims of Hope

Pope Francis proclaimed 2025 a Jubilee Year for the whole Church, with the theme 'Pilgrims of Hope'. 2024 was declared a Year of Prayer in-preparation.

The 2025 Jubilee Year theme, *Spes Non Confundit* (Hope Does Not Disappoint), calls us to anchor our lives in the steadfast hope that comes from God.

Archbishop Patrick opened the Jubilee Year in the Archdiocese of Adelaide on 31st December 2024 at midnight Mass at the Cathedral. The Jubilee will end on 28 December 2025.

Three places within the Archdiocese of Adelaide are designated as pilgrimage sites for the Holy Year:

- A) St Francis Xavier's Cathedral in Adelaide
- B) St Joseph's Church in Penola
- C) St Aloysius' Church in Sevenhill

As one of the pilgrimage sites of the Holy Year, we will pray the Jubilee Prayer at all Sunday Masses.

Opportunities for prayer at each of the pilgrimage sites will be advertised throughout the year as well as occasions when the Papal Blessing with the plenary indulgence will be imparted.
